Monday, August 5	 Breakfast at lodging Class: Social Capital and the Resilience of Cities; Cities in the global economy; The Social Psychology of City Life [Dr. Sillah] Lunch on your own Travel to Valley of the Sugar Mills: The center for sugar production in 18th and 19th centuries with over fifty sugarcane mills in operation and over 30,000 enslaved people working in the mills at the peak of production. Many of the mills are preserved and the area is a world heritage site and an important point of reflection on the use of enslaved labor in the Americas.
